We need to make sure that we're on the same page and get the kind of results we're both looking for."

### A NATURAL-LOOKING NOSE JOB

"You can spot a bad **RHINOPLASTY** by a conventional 'nose job look' essentially because the patient had large amounts of bone or cartilage removed," says Dr. Schwartz. "My approach is different. I want to preserve as much of the normal underlying tissues, cartilage, and bone as possible and just reshape them; that will often give a much more natural-looking and long-lasting result. With my technique, there are **MINIMAL INCISIONS AND TYPICALLY LESS BRUISING**. My patients tend to recover more quickly and have much less of an operated look. People often tell them, 'You look different, but I can't quite put my finger on what's changed.'" It's because they are drawn to the beauty of the patient's eyes, not the prominence of an unbalanced nose.
